## **Prerequisites**

30 hp (credits) in a subject with relevance to the teacher training program

## **Objectives**

After completing the course, the students should:

- be able to convert subject knowledge and educational knowledge into school praxis,
- illuminate and critically examine different school situations using learning theory as well as praxis perspectives,
- critically and constructively study school praxis from an international standpoint,
- be able to reflect upon his/her own role as a teacher

#### Content

During the internship the student is trained to teach on his/her own as well as together with the teacher educator at the local school. The training is located to a local school and carried out in co-operation with this school. An important part of the training is that the student understands the educational setting and can explain how learning activities fit within existing requirements and traditions.

## Type of Instruction

The course consists of internship where theory is integrated with practice. The course also consists of seminars where the student is trained to reflect upon school-based experiences using the course literature. These reflecting seminars are scheduled

regularly throughout the course.

Presence is compulsory during the full period of internship and at the seminar where the assignment is presented and discussed.

### Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

The grade A constitutes the highest grade on the scale and the remaining grades follow in descending order where the grade E is the lowest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as fail. (i.e. received the grade F).

Students who have not passed (i.e. received the grade of F) at the regular examination will be offered a new examination shortly after the regular examination.

Examination is done by testing the student's achievements during internship and with a written assignment. In the assignment, which should be presented orally and supervised and evaluated by the university, the student relates the schoolwork to educational insights and shows that she/he can reflect critically and constructively upon her/his role as a teacher in relation to the educational setting.

The mark "Passed" requires that learning goals are fulfilled and that the student has presented her/his paper at a seminar.

## **Course Evaluation**

After the course, students are given the opportunity to fill out anevaluation. The result of the evaluation is reported to the students and the document is archived according to the policy of the department.

### Other

Grade criteria for the A–F scale are communicated to the student through a special document. The student is to be informed about the grade criteria for the course by the start of the course at the latest.

To get access to schools/pre schools in Sweden it is required that you present a certificate from the police.
