The scope and expected outcomes of this course are follow-ing:

- Be able to understand, define and discuss the concept and phenomenon of Terrorism in a broader sense with a multidisciplinary approach, including legal, historical, psychological, economical and political perspectives.
- Be able to understand the nature, origins and manifestations of terrorism in modern time. Different strategies to handle it will be compared and evaluated on the basis of historical evidence and their probable consequences based on theoretical predictions made from different disciplines. Also, consequences for security and other psychological responses to terrorist attacks, particularly 11 Sep., attacks on WTC and Pentagon in USA, will be discussed in the course.
- Be able to analyse Terrorism from a gender perspective
