Förkunskaper

To be admitted to the course it is required to have 1-90 higher education credits in economics including at least two of the following courses: Intermediate Macroeconomics, 7,5 higher education credits, Intermediate Microeconomics, 7,5 higher education credits, Mathematical Economics II, 4 higher education credits.

Förväntade studieresultat

To deepening the knowledge of labour economics. After completing this course, the student is expected to be able to adapt and apply the labour economic theories and empirical analysis to a variety of problems.

Innehåll

The course includes the following topics:

- Labour Supply and Labour Demand
- Time use and the division of time within households
- Human Capital and Compensating wage differentials
- Wage determination and unemployment
- Labour market policy and regulations in the labour market

Undervisningsformer

Föreläsningar och seminarium. Deltagande i seminarium är obligatoriskt.

Examinationsformer

Kursen bedöms med betygen Underkänd, Godkänd eller Väl godkänd.

The examination can be done through oral examination or written test during or after the course. The examination can also be done through accounts of prescribed working projects. A combination of the aforementioned forms of examination is also possible.

A retest will be offered a few weeks after the original test for students who have not successfully passed the original test. At least 5 tests will be offered.

The grades are Pass with Distinction (80%-100%), Pass (60%-79%) or Failure (0%-59%).

Students at Linnaeus University are entitled to have the course grade translated into the 7-step ECTS scale. A request to have the grades translated must be made to the teacher at the start of the course.

Kursvärdering

A written course evaluation is performed and compiled into a report to be kept in the university school archives. The result and any measures taken are communicated to the course co-ordinator and presented to the students participating the next time the course is offered.
