Expected learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students should have:

- basic knowledge of cultural relations in the counties of Öland and Kalmar from a prehistoric archaeological perspective
- an insight into the archaeological research that has been, and is still being, carried out on prehistory and early history of these areas.

Content

A general popular scientific introduction to Scandinavia's prehistory, with special emphasis on the extensive research that has been carried out on the prehistory of the counties of Öland and Kalmar during the last decade.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is in the form of freestanding lectures and a voluntary excursion.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a written course evaluation is performed and compiled into a report. The evaluation report is available to students and is filed and stored according to departmental regulations.
