Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- account for and discuss didactic models and didactic design in relation to pedagogical situations in school and culture,
- reflect on the importance of images and visual mediation in learning processes,
- conduct and reflect on their own creative work in the fields of aesthetics and nature art,
- account for and discuss issues of sustainability in relation to nature and culture.
- · reflect on how multimodal resources can be used in primary school teaching,
- use digital, moving images and reflect in their pedagogical potential,
- produce and evaluate their own narration in the form of picture books,
- discuss and exemplify basic values in schools by using methods in educational drama.

Content

The course includes the following:

- · Didactics and design for learning,
- · Literary theory,
- The importance of visual mediation in learning processes,
- Land art/nature art, aesthetics and sustainability,
- Design focusing on multimodal expressions,
- Multimodality and learning,
- · Aspects concerning gender, class and ethnicity,
- · Narration in the form of picture books,
- Methods in educational drama.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is delivered in the form of lectures, study visits, seminars and practical workshops.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The course is examined through oral, written and creative assignments. Assessment is based in the following aspects: production, perception, reflection, methods and complexity. Irrespective of the form of examination, the performance of the individual student is assessed and examined.

Compulsory parts are specified in a study guide available on MyMoodle.

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives. Grading criteria for the grade of Pass with Distinction will be specified when the course starts. For students who do not pass the first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with local regulations at the university.

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are communicated to the students who have taken the course and the students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time. The evaluation is anonymous. The course evaluation is filed according to departmental regulations.
