Prerequisites

Drama 15 credits or the equivalent.

Expected learning outcomes

On completion of the course, students should be able to:

- understand and utilize different methods for teaching drama
- understand the historical development of theatre
- plan and lead drama work

Content

The course contains the following elements:

- drama exercises
- methods for teaching drama (such as role play, valuation exercises among other things)
- drama for special schools
- drama and theater history
- theater pedagogy
- project work

Type of Instruction

Teaching is in the form of lectures, laboratory elements, seminars and study visits. All elements of the course are mandatory.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

In order to pass the course, students need to meet the expected learning outcomes.

Basis of assessment is various assignments, individually and in groups such as leadership training, papers and literature seminars. The students are to present orally and in writing some assignments and also conduct a project work with a written report. Teaching is based on active participation of the students and their ability to implement knowledge into practical actions.

A resit for some of the course elements may only be offered during the course. For other elements a resit is offered within six weeks (within the framework of regular terms) and the number of resits is limited to five (in accordance with the Higher Education Ordinance 6 chap. 21§).

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a written course evaluation is performed and compiled into a report. The evaluation report is available to students and is filed and stored according to departmental regulations.
