Prerequisites

Drama 15 credits or the equivalent.

Objectives

After completing the course, the students should be able to:

- describe and, in groups, apply various methods for teaching drama,
- plan and conduct a small drama performance,
- plan and lead a drama project performed in a group of children, youths or adults.

Content

The course includes practice in methods for teaching drama, focusing on role-play and exercises including evaluation. The course also includes creative work in which various texts are used to create a small performance. At the end of the course, the students plan a project in which they work with drama in a group of children, youths or adults.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is delivered in the form of lectures, laboratory sessions, seminars and creative work.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the intended learning outcomes.

The course is examined through exercises in leadership, papers and literature seminars, individually and in groups. The students conduct oral and written presentations, and a project. The teaching is based on the students' active participation and their ability to

project. The teaching is based on the students' active participation and their ability to apply their knowledge.

For students who do not pass the first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with local regulations at the university.

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted and compiled into a report, which is made available to students and filed and stored according to departmental regulations.
