Prerequisites

One full year of university studies within a teacher education programme or similar and a good command of English

Expected learning outcomes

After completing the course the student should be able to

- account for Swedish school policies and cultures (curricula, school history, etc.),
- have developed, in consultation with a supervisor, the ability to plan and carry out sequences of teaching within a particular field.

Content

The course includes 3 weeks of internship in a Swedish school or other educational setting. It also comprises the study of the Swedish school system.

Type of Instruction

School practice supervised by a tutor in a Swedish school or other educational setting.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

Active participation in the internship programme will be assessed by the tutor in school together with the examiner.

One of the following grades is given: Godkänd, Underkänd (Pass, Fail). In addition,

ECTS-grades are awarded.

Course Evaluation

Teaching is continually evaluated throughout the semester.

At the end of the course, a written course evaluation is performed and compiled into a report. The evaluation report is available to students and is filed and stored according to departmental regulations.

Other

Students who receive a passing grade in the course are entitled to a course certificate upon request.
