Content

The course provides an overview of computer assisted / aided language learning and technology use in modern language teaching. The use of technology is discussed in connection with the developments in modern language teaching methodology and applied linguistics from the 1960s to the present focus on so-called 'one-to-one' computer solutions in the classroom and the use of tablet computers and mobile telephones. A central part of the course is devoted to the concept of digital literacy which combines a focus on language teaching and learning with technology use in the classroom. Course participants will also learn to evaluate the pedagogical use of ICT tools and resources for modern language teaching using Puenteduras SAMR model

Type of Instruction

Teaching will consist of an number of online webinars. Teaching will be in English.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives. Grading criteria for the grade of Pass with Distinction will be specified when the course starts. The course will be examined on the basis of project work and contributions to online forums. Course participants may choose to write their contributions in Swedish or

English as they prefer.

For students who do not pass the first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with local regulations at the university.

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are communicated to the students who have taken the course and the students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time. The evaluation is anonymous. The course evaluation will be filed in accordance with departmental regulations.
