### **Prerequisites**

After completing this course the student should be able to:

- apply basic data management and basic data base management
- apply models in financial accounting and financing

### **Content**

## Type of Instruction

Teaching is carried out as distance learning via a learning platform and consists of self-studies based on instructions from the course coordinator. The teaching consists of web-based group discussions. The course requires access to a computer with internet connection and a webcam.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

The course is examined through a serie of written, individual laboration 3 credits.

The grade G constitutes the highest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade U means that the student's performance is assessed as fail.

Resit examination is offered in accordance with Linnaeus University's Local regulations for courses and examination at the first- and second-cycle levels.

In the event that a student with a disability is entitled to special study support, the examiner will decide on adapted or alternative examination arrangements.
