Prerequisites

Business Administration 7.5 credits and English 6/English 2, or the equivalent.

Objectives

After completing this course the student should be able to:

- explain, describe and demonstrate practical skills in basic functions of management accounting programs
- apply basic data processing and basic database management in Excel
- apply models in the field of business administration sub-areas such as finance and costing

Content

The course covers the following areas and concepts:

- applied models in Economics and Administration

Type of Instruction

Teaching is carried out as distance learning via a learning platform and consists of self-studies based on instructions from the course coordinator. The teaching consists of self-studies based on instructions from the course coordinator and participation in web-based group discussions. The course requires access to a computer with internet connection and a webcam. No compulsory meetings on campus are included.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

The course is examined through two individual written laborations worth 1.5 credits each.

The grade G constitutes the highest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade U means that the student's performance is assessed as fail.

Resit examination is offered in accordance with Linnaeus University's Local regulations for courses and examination at the first- and second-cycle levels.

In the event that a student with a disability is entitled to special study support, the examiner will decide on adapted or alternative examination arrangements.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation should be conducted during the course or in connection with its conclusion.
