Prerequisites

General entry requirements and French as a third (foreign) language, course B/stage 3 (Field-specific entry requirements 2/A2).

Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- use general legal terminology and concepts from a French–Swedish contrastive perspective,
- apply knowledge of the French legal system and compare it to the Swedish one.

Content

This course discusses legal vocabulary in its cultural, communicative and professional contexts. The students are introduced to the legal system and themes such as legal texts, courts and legal systems.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is delivered in the form of lectures, seminars and exercises. The seminars include case studies which are discussed in groups. When the course is offered as an online part-time course, teaching is delivered through an online learning platform.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives. Grading criteria for the grade of Pass with Distinction will be specified when the course starts.

The course is examined through continuous oral and written assignments (3 credits) as well as a written assignment at the end of the course (4.5 credits).

In order to receive the grade of Pass with Distinction, the student must have received the grade of Pass with Distinction on the major written assignment at the end of the course.

If the university has decided that a student has the right to special educational support due to a disability, the examiner may offer an adapted test or allow the student to conduct the test in an alternative form.

For students who do not pass their first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examinations at the first and second levels at Linnaeus University.

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are communicated to the students who have taken the course. Students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time are informed of the results at the start of the course. The evaluation is anonymous.
