Objectives

After completing the course, students shall be able to:

- formulate gender study issues
- identify, formulate and analyse social issues on the basis of theories of gender studies
- perform information searches and evaluate sources on the basis of a gender perspective

Content

The course addresses important social phenomena as democracy, organisation, power and integration on the basis of gender studies. The course is intended to give the participants the opportunity to develop knowledge of the importance of gender in society. The course discusses issues on equality and equal treatment within various sectors in society such as job market, education and welfare.

Type of Instruction

Teaching consists of lectures, practical sessions and seminars.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

In order to receive a grade of Pass, the course objectives must be attained. In order to receive a grade of Pass with Distinction, the student must demonstrate very good skills orally as well as in writing in critical review and analysis of phenomena in society, based on theories and methods of gender studies. Examination is carried out through compulsory participation at seminars and through different assignments. The courses are concluded with an examination or written assignment.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation is carried out either during or at the end of the course. Results and analysis are presented to the students who have completed the course, and to the students at the following course date. The course evaluation is conducted anonymously.
