Objectives

After completing the course, students shall be able to:

- Account for and critically reflect on the social organisation of sport in Sweden.
- Describe, discuss and evaluate the formation of the Swedish sports policy at the municipal, regional and national levels.
- Discuss and problematize the social organisation of sport and the formation of the sports policy on the basis of the perspectives of equality, equity and rights.

Content

The course contains the following elements:

- The social organisation of sport in Sweden.
- The formation of the Swedish sports policy at the municipal, regional and national level.
- The social organisation of sport and the formation of the sports policy on the basis of the perspectives of equality, equity and rights.

Type of Instruction

Teaching consists of lectures, literature studies, group projects, supervision and seminars, of which some take place in a web-based form.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Examination of the course takes place by means of a group assignment presented orally, a group assignment presented in writing as well as orally, and an individual assignment presented in writing. In order to receive a grade of Pass, the grade of Pass is required for all examination assignments. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction in the course, it is required that the individual written assignment is assessed as Pass with Distinction.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation is carried out either during or at the end of the course. Results and analysis of the evaluation are presented to the students who have completed the course and to the students at the following course date. The course evaluation is conducted anonymously.
