Objectives

The aim of the course is for students to increase and put their theoretical knowledge into practice by demonstrating their skills during the implementation of specific tasks/assignments/projects at work. The aim is also to analyze and reflect on the completed assignment. The course is intended to prepare the students for the future job market.

After completing the course, students shall be able to

- under supervision, plan, organise and perform assignments relevant to the education
- document and summarize assignments relevant to the education, in writing
- present assignments relevant to the education, in writing as well as orally
- analyze and critically review completed assignments in relation to their own roles and the complexity of leadership

Content

The course contains the components planning, organisation and implementation of assignments in practice. Evaluating assignments both in theory as well as in practice is also included. Students shall also draw up a self-inventory, external environment inventory and an action plan in order to prepare the recruitment process for the coming job market.

Type of Instruction

Teaching consists of lectures, seminars, practice through assignments in different organisations as well as supervision, where the assignment is discussed regularly.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Examination of the course objectives takes place through a logbook describing the student's assignments from start to finish. The logbook is assessed by the grades Fail, Pass or Pass with Distinction. If required, renewed examination (a retake) of the logbook is offered at the next time the course is given. Examination of the course also takes place by means of an oral presentation of the assignment. The oral presentation is assessed by the grades Fail or Pass. In order to receive a grade of Pass, both examination assignments must be assessed as at least Pass. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction for the course, it is required that the examination of the logbook is graded as Pass with Distinction.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation is carried out either during or at the end of the course. Results and analysis of the evaluation are presented to the students who have completed the course as well as to the students at the following course date. The course evaluation is conducted anonymously.

Other

Any additional costs that may arise in connection with the course are paid for by the students themselves.

Required Reading and Additional Study Material

The literature is retrieved from previous courses taken in the Coaching and Sports Management programme. As the assignments are different, the students should use literature relevant to the assignments in question.
