Prerequisites

The course Leading and Organising in Sport and Health Organisations 15 credits, or the equivalent.

Objectives

The aim of the course is for students to enhance and put their theoretical knowledge into practice by demonstrating their skills during the implementation of specific tasks/assignments/projects at work. The aim is also to analyze and reflect on the completed assignment. The course is intended to prepare the students for the future job market.

After completing the course, students shall be able to

- under supervision, plan, organise and perform assignments relevant to the education
- in writing, document and summarize an assignment relevant to the education
- in writing as well as orally, present an assignment relevant to the education
- analyze and critically review the completed assignment in relation to their own roles and the complexity of leadership

Content

The course contains the components planning, organisation and implementation of tasks/assignments/projects in practice. The elements of documenting, summarizing, evaluating and presenting tasks/assignments/projects are also included. Students shall also draw up a self-inventory, external environment inventory and an action plan in order to prepare the recruitment process for the future job market.

Type of Instruction

Teaching consists of practical exercises, supervision, and seminars/workshops, partly in connection with another programme course in project management and partly in connection with LNU Career and the network for the Coaching and Sport Management study programme.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Examination of the course objectives takes place by means of two assignments. Both these assignments are completed individually or in groups. One of the assignments comprises 5 credits and consists of a description of the student's assignment from start to finish in the form of a report, a logbook and a final reflection. A retake of this examination is offered the next time the course is given. The second examination assignment comprises 1 credit and consists of an oral presentation of the assignment. The oral presentation is assessed by the grades Fail or Pass.

In order to receive a grade of Pass in the course, both examination assignments must be assessed as at least Pass.

To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction in the course, it is required that the examination consisting of a report, logbook and final reflection (5 credits) is assessed as Pass with Distinction, and the oral presentation of the assignment (1 credit) requires the grade of Pass.

A retake of the examination is provided in accordance with the Local Regulations for First-Cycle and Second-Cycle Courses and Examination at Linnaeus University.

Should the university determine that a student is entitled to special educational support due to impairment, the examiner may provide the student with an adapted test or the student may carry out the examination in an alternative way.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation is carried out either during or at the end of the course. Results and analysis of the evaluation are presented to the students who have completed the course as well as to the students at the following course date. The course evaluation is conducted anonymously.

Other

Any additional costs that may arise in connection with the course are paid for by the students themselves.

Required Reading and Additional Study Material

The literature is retrieved from previous courses taken in the Coaching and Sports Management programme. As the assignments are different, the students should use literature relevant to the assignments in question.
