Prerequisites

General entry requirements, completed and passed 30 credits in Special Sport or in an equivalent course.

Objectives

Upon completion of the course, students shall be able to:

- account for various scientific traditions, knowledge approaches and scientifically related perceptions of reality,
- account for various epistemological traditions and their application,
- account for various research methodological traditions, the associated conditions and fields of application as well as be able to apply these,
- develop research designs.

Content

One important factor in being able to enhance your scientifically based knowledge in sports is being able to use and understand the traditions within the theory of science. The course emphasizes and discusses how students may use varying scientific

traditions, knowledge approaches and scientifically based perceptions of reality to create the foundation of new innovative thoughts, ideas and solutions in relation to issues within the field of sports. In order to be able to enhance these aspects, students must acquire knowledge of research methodological traditions and techniques as well as learn how to apply the same. The students will also learn how to develop research designs and implement these in practice. This means that the students must be able to prepare and conduct data collections and develop databases, analyse data in a scientific manner and evaluate and critically reflect on the scientific knowledge development.

Type of Instruction

Teaching consists of lectures, supervision and seminars.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Examination of the course takes place by means of a written assignment.

In order to receive a grade of Pass, the student must attain the course objectives. For a grade of Pass with Distinction, it is required that the student in the written assignment is able to demonstrate that they have attained the course objectives in an informed and advanced manner.

A retake of the examination is provided in accordance with the Local Regulations for First-Cycle and Second-Cycle Courses and Examination at Linnaeus University.

Should the university determine that a student is entitled to special educational support due to impairment, the examiner may provide the student with an adapted test or the student may carry out the examination in an alternative way.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation is carried out either during or at the end of the course. Results and analysis of the evaluation are presented to the students who have completed the course as well as to new students at the following course date. The course evaluation is conducted anonymously.
