Prerequisites

Chinese for beginners I, 7,5 credits or the equivalent.

Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- explain and use common and relevant expressions,
- use approximately 700 Chinese characters,
- express themselves using approximately 500 words in Chinese,
- describe their personal background and environment in basic terms,
- write basic texts in the form of letters or diary entries on individual topics or interests.

Content

The course includes studies of basic grammar and Chinese characters, exercises in oral and written presentations, and listening and reading comprehension.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is delivered in the form of oral and written exercises. The written parts of the teaching use traditional kanji, i.e. traditional characters. The students choose a textbook in traditional kanji or one in simplified kanji.

The course includes lectures and seminars.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives. The grade of A is the highest grade and the grade of E is the lowest grade for passing the course. The grade of F means that the student has failed the course. Grading criteria for the grades A–F will be specified when the course starts.

The course is examined through written examinations and assignments.

In order to receive the grade of A or B on the course as a whole, the student must have received the grade of A or B on at least 4.5 credits including the Final Examination.

For students who do not pass the first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with local regulations at the university.

Supplementary examination of compulsory seminar exercises is carried out in the form of an oral or written assignment.

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are communicated to the students who have taken the course and the students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time. The evaluation is anonymous. The course evaluation is filed according to departmental regulations.
