Prerequisites

Objectives

After completing the course, students should be able to:

- write short texts in children's literature genres
- in a text-critical way put the student's own writing in relation to today's children's and youth literature,
- in a critical way account for relevant parts of the history of children's literature, as well as its terminology and methods, through academic writing,
- use the Swedish language in a proper and creative way in writing.

Content

The course has a creative, artistic approach, and gives an introduction to writing for children and adolescents. This course focuses on the student's own writing but also contains assignments in comparative literature. The student works with narrative technique, and also creates a coherent text in the field of children's literature, which is developed in consultation with the teacher. The student also reads fiction texts to

support their own writing.

Type of Instruction

The teaching is distance-based and carried out on an online learning platform. Teaching is delivered in the form of lectures and supervision of fiction writing and response to academically written texts.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

The course is examined continuously through oral and written assignments. In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives.

For students who do not pass their first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examinations at the first and second levels at Linnaeus University. If the university has decided that a student has the right to special educational support due to a disability, the examiner may offer an adapted test or allow the student to conduct the test in an alternative form.

Course Evaluation

During or shortly after the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are promptly communicated to the students who have taken the course. Students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time are informed of the results at the start of the course.
