Prerequisites

Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- interpret and discuss children's literature from historical, theoretical and didactic perspectives.

After completing Module 1, Children's literature, an introduction, 7.5 credits, the student should be able to:

- account for the basic parts of the history of children's literature,
- account for theories, terminology and methods in research on children's literature,
- conduct basic analyses of literary texts for children,
- account for possible ways to use children's literature in educational work in pre-school.

After completing module 2, The picture-book in theory and practice, 7.5 credits, the student should be able to:

- account for the historical development and modern form of picture-books,
- conduct basic analyses of literary texts using relevant tools presented during the course,
- discuss and also possible ways to use picture books in practical educational work.

- discuss and plan possible ways to use picture books in practical educational work in pre-school.

Content

This course provides a broad introduction to children's literature, focusing on literature for young children. It includes the history of children's literature, an introduction to analytical tools, and a survey of various interesting authorships. The course also focuses on literary didactics and how literature can be used in pre-school in order to, among other things, promote children's language development and future reading abilities.

Module 1. Children's literature, an introduction, 7.5 credits

The module covers children's literature and its history, focusing on the 20th century and the present. It focuses on literature and how literature can be used in educational work in pre-school. Literary models for analysis of children's literature are introduced and perspectives such as gender, class and ethnicity are discussed. The module also includes close study of a number of texts.

Module 2. The picture-book in theory and practice, 7.5 credits

In this module the student acquires knowledge and practical competence to work actively, purposefully and joyfully with picture-books in pre-school. The module presents tools for aesthetic and didactic interpretation and analysis of literature, and methods for educational work with stories for young children, in the form of books as well as other media.

Type of Instruction

Teaching consists of recorded lectures and group discussions online.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Both modules are examined through take-home examinations, contributions to discussions, and peer review. In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives. In order to receive the grade of Pass with Distinction (VG) for the course as a whole, the student must have received this grade for both modules. Additional grading criteria can be found in the course study guide.

For students who do not pass their first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examinations at the first and second levels at Linnaeus University. If the university has decided that a student has the right to special educational support due to a disability, the examiner may offer an adapted test or allow the student to conduct the test in an alternative form.

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are to be promptly communicated to the students who have taken the course. Students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time are informed of the results at the start of the course. The evaluation is anonymous.
