Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- discuss the current Nobel Prize winner's authorship,
- place this authorship in relevant national and international contexts,
- · draw conclusions about the significance and function of literary canons.

Content

The course provides a comprehensive survey of the most recent Nobel Prize winner's authorship. Focus will be placed on the reading and analysis of texts, partly as separate aesthetic objects and partly as interplay with contemporary literary and political currents. The course also problemizes the view of literary canons in general and the Nobel Prize's canonizing effect in particular.

Type of Instruction

This course is online and all lectures and seminars is also online.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Examination occurs through take-home exams and/or discussionposts.

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives. Grading

criteria for the grade of Pass with Distinction will be specified when the course starts. For students who do not pass the first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with local regulations at the university.

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are communicated to the students who have taken the course and the students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time. The evaluation is anonymous. The course evaluation is filed according to departmental regulations.
