## **Prerequisites**

## **Objectives**

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- in general terms account for the development of the romance genre during the last three decades,
- discuss romance as a part of popular literature,
- critically review romantic fiction.

#### Content

Romance is a major and important part of popular literature today. This course includes an extensive introduction to the genre. The students read and compare romance from three decades, and discuss romance in relation to popular literary tradition. The course starts with classical romantic fiction from the 19th century, often referred to as the start of the genre. Then it discusses both the historical development of romance and modern romance, focusing specifically on chick lit from the 1970s, 1980s and 1990s. Finally, the course discusses the development of the genre in the 21st century, including some recent popular works of romance.

Compulsory online seminars are included in the course.

## Type of Instruction

The teaching is distance-based and carried out on an online learning platform.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives. Grading criteria for the grade of Pass with Distinction will be specified when the course starts. The course is examined continuously through assignments with given deadlines and compulsory contributions to discussions.

For students who do not pass the first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with local regulations at the university.

## Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted and compiled into a report, which is made available to students and filed and stored according to departmental regulations.
