Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- problematise central themes in contemporary young adult fiction, such as sustainability and power in genres such as fantasy, dystopia and everyday realism,
- discuss and problematise fan fiction, graphic novels and comics,
- analyse a few examples of contemporary young adult fiction using theoretical tools presented in the module.

Content

The course focuses on contemporary young adult literature on the basis of a broad understanding of the text concept, including films, graphic novels and comics. Various genres such as graphic novel, fanfiction and film are discussed. Dominant themes in today's young adult fiction, for example dystopian visions of the future, are also discussed and problematised. Sustainability and power are recurrent perspectives discussed in the course.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is in the form of written and recorded lectures and group discussions.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The course is examined through two individual written discussion posts with peer review, and a written take-home examination. In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives. Grading criteria for the grade of Pass with Distinction will be specified in writing when the course starts.

For students who do not pass their first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examinations at the first and second levels at Linnaeus University. If the university has decided that a student has the right to special educational support due to a disability, the examiner may offer an adapted test or allow the student to conduct the test in an alternative form.

Course Evaluation

During or shortly after the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are promptly communicated to the students who have taken the course. Students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time are informed of the results at the start of the course. The course evaluation is to be carried out anonymously.
