## Objectives

Upon completion of the course the student should:

- have implemented a web production project with methods relevant for the subject  
Media Technology
- show deeper knowledge in web development
- show knowledge in evaluation of projects

## Content

The course consists of the following parts:

- Project methodology
- Development of a client-based website built on principles about information architecture and user-centered design
- Planning and implementation of a project in a working team
- Evaluation of method and result

## Type of Instruction

The teaching consists of lectures, laborations and seminars. The project is carried out as a group project.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The examination consists of account of a group project. This include accounts for both partial result and the final result. The presentation consists of publication of produced web project, written report and oral presentation.

The report is presented at a seminar. Students work in the project (group project) is assessed individually.
