#### Prerequisites

General entry requirements and Civics 1b / 1a1 +1a2 or Civics A, English B (Fieldspecific entry requirements 6/A6). with the exception of English B.

### Objectives

After completing the course, the students should be able to:

- account for concepts and definitions in basic radio production for editorial or journalistic purposes,
- account for basic technical aspects concerning production and narration on the radio,
- design and produce digital artefacts for the medium of radio which reach a basic publishable level,
- account for and justify design- and production-technical choices made during a production process.

#### Content

This course includes a basic introduction to radio production including its tools, concepts, theories and methods. It also includes audio engineering, program and feature analysis, recording, editing, self-op, reporting, narrative techniques for radio, applied research, script writing for radio, and applied interviewing for radio. All parts in which the course objectives are examined are compulsory.

#### Type of Instruction

Teaching is delivered in the form of lectures, supervision and exercises.

#### Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG)

The course is examined through a written examination, a written assignment, a laboratory session and seminars. In order to receive the grade of pass, the student must achieve the course objectives. The grading criteria are available in a document communicated to the students when the course starts.
