Expected learning outcomes

By the end of the course the student is expected to be able to:

- · analyse structures and forms in lyrics, melodies and arrangements
- · compose melodies, lyrics and also arrange and document these
- show increased awareness of the processes, possibilities and problems of practical music making
- show elementary understanding of how to create and edit sound
- show elementary understanding of recording- and sound techniques
- show elementary knowledge about how to edit recorded sound into a finished music product, and convert and store them in different manners

Content

The course includes the following sub courses:

Module 2 Music Production 7.5 credits

- Recording techniques
- Recording

Type of Instruction

Teaching is based on the students' active participation individually and in groups.

Teaching may be in the form of lectures, practical implementation and seminars. The independent studies of the students are important parts of the course. All teaching is obligatory, unless otherwise agreed with the examiner.

The language of instruction is Swedish.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

In order to pass the course the student needs to meet the expected learning outcomes.

The course is assessed via written, verbal and/or practical assignments, individually and/or in groups. Regardless of the form of presentation the individual achievements of the student are always assessed and graded.
