Prerequisites

A minimum of 10 credits in Police Work, first cycle.

Objectives

Upon completion of the course, students shall be able to:

- account for the most common narcotic drugs and the associated signs and symptoms
- account for the most common mental illnesses and neuropsychiatric disorders
- apply an adequate, ethical and tactical treatment and approach in relation to people who suffer from mental illness, neuropsychiatric disorders and/or who are under the influence of drugs
- conduct and account for the legal measures taken when being confronted with mental health disorders, drugs and substance abuse
- describe comorbidity, the correlation between mental health disorders and substance abuse.

Content

The course initially provides basic knowledge of the most common narcotic drugs used, and the effect these have on the human body. Harmful products and doping are also discussed. Relevant legislation is addressed, as well as the police investigation procedures concerning crimes related to narcotics, harmful products and doping drugs.

The course provides basic knowledge of diagnoses and neuropsychiatric disorders related to the concept of mental ill-health/mental disorder.

Furthermore, the concept of comorbidity is also discussed, for instance the correlation between substance abuse and mental ill-health, and the general view on how drugs and substance abuse may be related to crime prevention within the police.

Relevant legislation is put in relation to treatment and communication when approaching individuals who suffer from mental health disorders. Special emphasis is placed on the interfaces between law, tactical approach and treatment of individuals who suffer from mental health disorders and/or substance misuse issues.

Type of Instruction

Teaching take place through base group work, supervision, lectures and practical application. Practical elements are trained by the use of demonstrations, practical exercises, supervision, films and lectures.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Examination of the course takes place by means of a practical exercise and a written exam.

In order to receive a grade of Pass in the course, students are required to attain the intended learning outcomes in both examinations. To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction in the course, it is required that the written exam is assessed as Pass with Distinction.

A retake of the examination is provided in accordance with the Local Regulations for First-cycle and Second-cycle Courses and Examination at Linnaeus University.

Should the university determine that a student is entitled to special educational support due to impairment, the examiner may provide the student with an adapted test or the student may carry out the examination in an alternative way.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation is carried out either during or at the end of the course. Results and analysis of the evaluation are presented to the students who have completed the course as well as to new students at the following course date. The course evaluation is conducted anonymously.
