## Objectives

On completion of the course, students should be able to:

- Account for the main features of Swedish civil and commercial law
- Find and analyse legal material that is relevant to the course, such as legal preparatory work, law and material from other legal sources
- Identify the following legal fields: intellectual property law, civil law, contract law, sales law, tort law, labour law, corporate law, marketing law as well as enforcement law and creditor rights
- Solve simpler legal problems within the above mentioned legal fields

## Content

The course begins with an overview of the Swedish legal system's structure and a run-through of basic legal method.

Thereafter, the course contains a basic run-through of intellectual property law, civil law, contract law, sales law, tort law, labour law, corporate law, marketing law as well as enforcement law and creditor rights. Students also receive supervision in information retrieval as regards legal source material.

## Type of Instruction

Teaching is in the form of lectures and seminars

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The course is assessed with the grades Fail, Pass or Pass with credit.

To receive a grade of pass, all expected learning outcomes must be fulfilled; the grade is determined by how well the student has fulfilled the expected learning outcomes. For combination of grades, please see the document "Principles for reporting of grades dnr 2011/160".

The course is examined through a written test. The basis for grading is determined by how well the student has fulfilled the expected learning outcomes.

Students who do not receive a grade of Pass will be given the opportunity to take a resit examination; usually about 5-8 weeks after the original examination. A total of five resit examinations are offered for written examinations.

## Course Evaluation

A written course evaluation is done and is collected into a report that is archived at the institution. The result and if actions are taken is presented to the students at the next instance of the course or in another way that the course responsible finds suitable. Other forms of evaluation as e.g. continuously during the course or talks with the students are used and encouraged with the aim of guaranteeing continuous quality improvement.
