Prerequisites

General entry requirements. General entry requirements and Civics 1b / 1a1 +1a2, Mathematics 2a / 2b / 2c or Civics A, Mathematics B (Field-specific entry requirements 5/A5). General entry requirements and Mathematics B or Mathematics 2a / 2b / 2c.

Objectives

After completed the course the student is expected to be able to:

- find and analyze relevant legal material for the course;
- identify the area or areas of law to which a given problem relates: intellectual property law, market law, freedom of expression law and regulations that are relevant to online activities;
- understand the influence of law and its significance for interactive media and web technologies.

Content

The course contains:

- overview of the structure of the Swedish legal system and a review of basic legal methods
- project design as a client-based website that is built based on principles of information architecture and user-centered design
- basic review of intellectual property law, market law, freedom of expression law and regulations for personal data processing and other regulations that are important for online activities
- legal tools and the legal rules governing areas of digital media and web design, and
- search for information regarding legal source material

Type of Instruction

Teaching consists of lectures, laboratory work and seminars. The project is carried out as a group work. Dates for compulsory elements are stated in the schedule.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

The course is examined by written assignment conducted individually or in a group. Grading criteria for the U–G scale are communicated in writing to the student by the start of the course.

Repeat examination is offered in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examination at the first and second-cycle level at Linnaeus University.

If the university has decided that a student is entitled to special pedagogical support due to a disability, the examiner has the right to give a customised exam or to have the student conduct the exam in an alternative way.

Course Evaluation

During the completion of the course or in close connection with the course, a course evaluation is carried out. Results and analysis of completed course evaluation shall be promptly fed back to the students who have completed the course. Students who participate in the next course opportunity will receive feedback at the start of the course. Course evaluation is carried out anonymously.
