## Objectives

After completing this course the student should be able to:

- find and analyze relevant legal material for the course;
- identify the area or areas of law to which a given problem relates: intellectual property law, market law, freedom of expression law and regulations that are relevant to online activities;
- understand the influence of law and its significance for interactive media and web technologies.

## Content

The course contains:

- overview of the structure of the Swedish legal system and a review of basic legal methods
- project design as a client-based website that is built based on principles of

- information architecture and user-centered design
- basic review of intellectual property law, market law, freedom of expression law and regulations for personal data processing and other regulations that are important for online activities
- legal tools and the legal rules governing areas of digital media and web design, and
- search for information regarding legal source material

## Type of Instruction

The teaching consists of lectures and seminars.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

The course is examined by written assignment conducted individually or in a group (3 credits).

The grade G constitutes the highest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade U means that the student's performance is assessed as fail. Grading criteria for the U–G scale are communicated in writing to the student by the start of the course at the latest, as well as how the weighting and weighting of grades on individual examining elements to the final course grade takes place. The basis for the student's grade is determined by the student's fulfillment of the objectives.

Repeat examination is offered in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examination at the first and second-cycle level at Linnaeus University. An examiner can, in exceptional cases, decide that a student who is close to the level for a passing grade may carry out supplementary assignments in order to reach the passing grade.

If the university has decided that a student is entitled to special pedagogical support due to a disability, the examiner has the right to give a customised exam or to have the student conduct the exam in an alternative way.

## Course Evaluation

During the implementation of the course or in close conjunction with the course, a course evaluation is to be carried out. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are to be promptly presented as feedback to the students who have completed the course. Students who participate during the next course instance receive feedback at the start of the course. The course evaluation is to be carried out anonymously.
