Prerequisites

General entry requirements.

Objectives

after completing the course the student is expected to be able to:

- account for the main features of Swedish civil and commercial law
- find and analyse legal material that is relevant to the course, such as legal preparatory work, law and material from other legal sources
- identify the following legal fields: intellectual property law, civil law, contract law, sales law, tort law, labour law, corporate law, marketing law, real estate law as well as enforcement law and creditor rights
- solve simpler legal problems within the above mentioned legal fields

Content

The course begins with an overview of the Swedish legal system's structure and a run-through of basic legal method. Thereafter, the course contains a basic run-through of intellectual property law, civil law, contract law, sales law, tort law, labour law, corporate law, marketing law, real estate law as well as enforcement law and creditor rights. Students also receive supervision in information retrieval as regards legal source material.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is in the form of lectures and seminars. Obligatory elements are stated in the schedule.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.
The course is examined through a written test.

The grade A constitutes the highest grade on the scale and the remaining grades follow in descending order where the grade E is the lowest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as fail.

After each regular examination there will be at least one new examination in close proximity to the date the results of the regular exam were posted. A minimum of five occasions for written exams will be offered in relation to the syllabus to which the student was accepted. Usually three occasions per academic year are offered. Students that fail reports can complement after instructions from the examiner to obtain a pass grade.

Grading criteria for the A–F scale are communicated in writing to the student by the start of the course/module at the latest, as well as how grades on separate elements of examination are weighed to a final course grade.

Course Evaluation

During the implementation of the course or in close connection to the course a course evaluation is to be carried out. Result and analysis of the course evaluation is to be presented as feedback both to the students who have completed the course and to the students who are to participate on the course the next time it is offered. The course evaluation is to be carried out anonymously.
