### **Prerequisites**

General entry requirements. English 6 or the equivalent.

### **Objectives**

After completing this course the student should be able to:

- find and analyze the main aspects of legal material within international contract law and sales law
- describe the main features of international private law and European law
- explain and investigate the principle elements of responsibility and indemnity

- identify certain legal problems and apply jurisprudence to solve chosen legal problems

## Content

The course contains an overview of international business law where competition law, regulations regarding exports and imports, and the meaning of freedom of movement within the EU will be discussed. The focus of the course is the legal space for business and commercial contracts and dispute resolution.

## Type of Instruction

The teaching consists of lectures and seminars. Dates for compulsory components are stated in the schedule.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E or F.

The course is examined through group projects presented in seminars 1,5 credits and through a written exam 6 credits.

The grade A constitutes the highest grade on the scale and the remaining grades follow in descending order where the grade E is the lowest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as fail.

Repeat examination is offered in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examination at the first and second-cycle level at Linnaeus University. An examiner can, in exceptional cases, decide that a student who is close to the level for a passing grade may carry out supplementary assignments in order to reach the passing grade.

If the university has decided that a student is entitled to special pedagogical support due to a disability, the examiner has the right to give a customised exam or to have the student conduct the exam in an alternative way.

## Course Evaluation

During the implementation of the course or in close conjunction with the course, a course evaluation is to be carried out. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are to be promptly presented as feedback to the students who have completed the course. Students who participate during the next course instance receive feedback at the start of the course. The course evaluation are in regular carried out anonymously.

The course cannot be included in a degree along with the following course/courses of which the content fully, or partly, corresponds to the content of this course: 1RV021 and 1RV100 with 7,5 credits each.
