Prerequisites

1RV302 Administrative Law I, 15 credits, or equivalent.

Objectives

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- account for general administrative law, parts of specific administrative law and administrative procedure,
- account for the parts of the regulations that govern to what extent government and municipalities can influence the functional methods of the market,
- discuss the impact of EU law on the areas discussed in the course.

Competence and skills

- identify main legal issues within the field of general as well as specific administrative law, as well as within the field of administrative procedure,
- argue for and against different solutions for legal issues within the above-mentioned areas, in writing as well as orally,
- apply and integrate knowledge and relevant regulations of the course's different sub-areas in relation to real legal issues within the above-mentioned areas.

Judgement and approach

- at a general level, discuss critically phenomena and issues within the scope of the course,
- identify and define conceivable legal solutions for such issues.

Content

The course involves in-depth studies of general administrative law as well as parts of the specific administrative law, such as social insurance legislation and migration legislation. Administrative procedure is also looked into in the course. Moreover, the inner market of the EU is discussed, in terms of the regulatory framework that govern to what extent government and municipalities may influence the functional methods of the market, such as EU state aid legislation and parts of the regulatory framework that governs public procurement.

Type of Instruction

Types of instruction include lectures and seminars.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Examination of the course takes place by means of seminars (2.5 credits), one individual written assignment (2.5 credits) and one individual on-campus written exam (10 credits).

In order to receive a grade of Pass, the course objectives shall be attained.

To be awarded a grade of Pass with Distinction in the course, it is required that the individual written assignment and the written exam are graded Pass with Distinction.

A retake of the examination is offered in accordance with the Local Regulations for First-cycle and Second-cycle Courses and Examination at Linnaeus University.

In the event a student with a disability is entitled to special study support, the examiner will decide on adapted or alternative examination arrangements.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation should be conducted during the course or in connection with its conclusion. The results and analysis of the completed course evaluation should be promptly communicated to students who have completed the course. Students participating in the next course instance should be informed of the results of the previous course evaluation and any improvements that have been made, no later than at

the start of the course.
