## Objectives

On completion of the course, students should be able to:

- account for the main features of the Swedish legal system
- find and analyse legal material that is relevant to the course
- identify one or all of the following legal fields that a given problem relates to: contract law, sales law, creditor law, tort law, corporate law, labour law and family law
- solve simpler legal problems within the above mentioned legal fields
- verbally and/or in writing - structure and present legal questions and solutions to problems

## Content

The course begins with an overview of the Swedish legal system's structure and a run-through of fundamental legal methods as well as basic EU law. After this, the course contains a basic run-through of contract law, sales law, tort law, labour law, corporate law, creditor law and family law. Students also receive supervision in information retrieval as far as legal source material goes.

## Type of Instruction

Teaching is in the form of lectures and seminars.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The various elements can be examined in groups and/or individually.

Assessment of students performances is carried out in the form of written examinations as well as written and/or oral presentations.

Students who do not achieve a satisfactory result in the examinations are permitted to make a second attempt approximately 5-8 weeks after the normal examination date. The student will have a minimum of five occasions for written exams in relation to the syllabus to which the student was accepted. Usually 3 occasions per academic year.

The course is graded with the following grades: pass with credit (80%-100%), pass (60%-79%), fail (0%-59%) as well as A-F according to ECTS grading scale. Grades are based on how well students fulfil the expected learning outcomes.

## Course Evaluation

A written course evaluation is performed and compiled into a report to be kept in the university school archives. The result and any measures taken are communicated to the course co-ordinator and presented to the students participating the next time the course is offered.
