Prerequisites

Commercial Law 1-15 credits or equivalent.

Objectives

The objective of the course is to provide students with a broader knowledge in commercial law so that they can independently identify and manage problems associated with commercial law

On completion of the course, students should be able to:

- identify and analyse legal issues within the particular area
- find the adequate legal rules and solve commercial law problems on the basis of legal methods
- verbally and in writing, structure and present legal questions and solutions to problems

Content

The course is a continuation course from Commercial Law I and concentrates on rules of importance for the functioning of accounting.

The course contains a specialisation of knowledge on the Swedish property law as far as general and special contract law and corporate law goes. Within contract law, contracts are discussed in detail with help of middleman and specialised knowledge of

purchase of moveable and immoveable property as well as an orientation of other types of contracts such as service, hire, leasing and contract by tender.

Furthermore, elements concerning credit and insolvency law that include a run-through of creditors' legal regulations and different forms of credit guarantees as well as knowledge of voluntary and compulsory measures in the case of financial distress and insolvency are discussed.

What is more, economic compulsory measures such as injunction to pay, seizure and attachment are discussed.

The course also includes elements comprising of criminal law's general and special parts with emphasis on property and economic crimes.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is in the form of lectures and seminars.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The course is examined through individual written examinations and through papers written in groups, as specified in course instructions. Examination also include oral presentation in a professional manner. Active participation in mandatory seminars is required for a pass grade.

Students who do not achieve a satisfactory result in the examinations are permitted to make a second attempt approximately 5-8 weeks after the normal examination date. The student will have a minimum of five occasions for written exams in relation to the syllabus to which the student was accepted. Usually 3 occasions per academic year.

The grading is based on assessment of the written exams, reports and the student's ability to present and discuss report contents. Results are graded using one of the terms Passed with distinction, Pass or Fail.

Course Evaluation

A written evaluation is conducted and compiled in a report, which is filed at the department. The result and actions, if taken, are communicated to the teacher responsible for the course and presented to the students in the way most appropriate according to the teacher responsible for the course. Other types of evaluations, such as continuous during the course or oral communication with the students, can occur and is encouraged to secure continuous quality improvement.
