Prerequisites

General entry requirements.

Objectives

On completion of the course, students should be able to:

- describe the main features in the Swedish Legal System
- account for sources of law
- describe and explain the fundamental principles of market law and civil law
- find and analyse legal material that is relevant to the course
- identify civil law and market law problems and apply legal methods for solving such simple legal problems
- motivate and argue for their suggested solutions in a legal and acceptable way
- assess and criticise/defend their own, and other students', suggested solutions, partly on the basis of existing systems of regulation and partly on the basis of ethical stand points.

Content

The course begins with an overview of the Swedish Legal System's structure and a run-through of fundamental legal methods as well as basic EU law. After this, the course contains a run-through of basic civil law with focus on the responsibilities of civil, and market, law as well as intellectual property law and market law.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is in the form of lectures and seminars. Obligatory parts are stated in the schedule.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.
The course is examined through written examination.

The grade A constitutes the highest grade on the scale and the remaining grades follow in descending order where the grade E is the lowest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as fail.

After each regular examination there will be at least one new examination in close proximity to the date the results of the regular exam were posted. A minimum of five occasions for written exams will be offered in relation to the syllabus to which the student was accepted. Usually three occasions per academic year are offered. Students that fail reports can complement after instructions from the examiner to obtain a pass grade.

Grading criteria for the A–F scale are communicated in writing to the student by the start of the course/module at the latest, as well as how grades on separate elements of examination are weighed to a final course grade.

Course Evaluation

During the implementation of the course or in close connection to the course a course evaluation is to be carried out. Result and analysis of the course evaluation is to be presented as feedback both to the students who have completed the course and to the students who are to participate on the course the next time it is offered. The course evaluation is to be carried out anonymously.

This course cannot be part of a degree in combination with another course in which the content fully or partly correspond to the content of this course: IRV835, 15 credits.
