Expected learning outcomes

After completing the course the student is expected to

- give an overview of the regulation of labour law/work environment law and social insurance law in Sweden, its relation to the corresponding parts of EC law, and be able to propose how EC directives, laws and regulations concerning labour law/labour environment law and social insurance law as well as the corresponding parts of EC law may be handled in Sweden .
- be able to propose solutions to labour law, work environment law and social insurance law cases on the basis of the prerequisites laid down in the controlling legal systems and to conclude local employment agreements and implement systematic work environment activities.

Content

The course comprises labour law, public law and civil law systems: employment, codetermination and contract terms. Right-of-access and secrecy. Association law, work environment law and social insurance law, the EU, EC law and labour law.

Type of Instruction

The joint gatherings consist of lectures, group work, supervision and presentations.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades U,3,4 or 5.

On request, students may have their credits translated to ECTS-marks. Such a request must be sent to the examiner before the grading process starts.
