Prerequisites

This is a contract course, and admission is determined in consultation with the client.

Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- account for how language patterns, values and hierarchies in school may affect pupils' learning;
- plan pedagogical work in linguistically and culturally heterogenous learning environments;
- account for the design of teaching that promotes language development from a second language perspective.

Content

This course introduces Swedish as a second language and discusses what is required in a learning environment where different norms and values meet and are developed. The course also provides tools for developing teaching of multilingual pupils and pupils that have recently arrived in Sweden.

Type of Instruction

The course is based on research and qualified experience. Teaching aims at a practical perspective, and is carried out as part of the student's own professional practice, in the

form of studies and development work in their own work place. In addition to this, teaching is delivered in the form of lectures and seminars.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

The course is examined continuously, through oral presentations and written hand-in assignments.

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives.

If the university has decided that a student is entitled to special pedagogical support due to a disability, the examiner has the right to give a customised exam or to have the student conduct the exam in an alternative way.

Repeat examination is offered in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examination at the first and second-cycle level at Linnaeus University.

Course Evaluation

During or shortly after the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are promptly communicated to the students who have taken the course. Students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time are informed of the results at the start of the course. The evaluation is anonymous.
