### **Prerequisites**

Icelandic, basic course I, 7.5 credits, or the equivalent.

## Objectives

After completing the course, the students should be able to:

- read and understand Icelandic texts using a dictionary,
- use everyday phrases in Icelandic,
- account for Icelandic culture and society from contemporary and historical perspectives.

## Content

In this course the students develop basic practical and theoretical knowledge of Icelandic, focusing on pronunciation, grammar, word formation and syntax. The course also includes an introduction to Icelandic society and culture.

## Type of Instruction

Teaching is delivered in the form of teaching material distributed online, and virtual seminars.

## Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the intended learning outcomes.

The course is examined through written and oral assignments.

## Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted and compiled into a report, which is made available to students and filed and stored according to departmental regulations.
