Prerequisites

General entry requirements and previous studies of at least 15 credits in Swedish with a didactic specialisation, or the equivalent.

Objectives

After completing the module, the student should be able to:

- account in general terms for the political background of Nordic collaboration;
- account in general terms for knowledge about the languages, culture, and general societal aspects of the Nordic countries;
- understand the Scandinavian languages Swedish, Danish, and Norwegian, in writing as well as in speech;
- adapt their own language in order to communicate with other Scandinavians;
- account for knowledge about basic language didactics;
- know about different ways of teaching about the Nordic countries and neighbouring languages, when teaching the subject of Swedish and other subjects.

Content

This course is a general introduction to Nordic languages and the Nordic language community, focusing in particular on similarities and differences between Swedish, Danish and Norwegian. Cultural and societal aspects are discussed with a focus on common features, but colonial perspectives, power relations and minorities in Scandinavia are also brought up. The course has a didactic perspective based on how language is learnt, and the students get the opportunity to practise both understanding and communicating with other Scandinavians. The course is taught in Swedish, Danish and Norwegian.

Type of Instruction

The course is entirely web-based. Teaching is delivered in the form of lectures and seminars via a digital learning platform.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The course is examined through written and oral assignments.

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives. Grading criteria for the grade of Pass with Distinction will be specified in writing when the course starts.

If the university has decided that a student has the right to special educational support due to a disability, the examiner may offer an adapted test or allow the student to conduct the test in an alternative form.

For students who do not pass their first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examinations at the first and second levels at Linnaeus University.

Course Evaluation

During or shortly after the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are promptly communicated to the students who have taken the course. Students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time are informed of the results at the start of the course. The evaluation is anonymous.
