Objectives

After completing the course, the students should be able to:

- use the Swedish language functionally to express themselves in various contexts,
- account for various aspects of Swedish society and culture.

Content

This course includes reading and writing exercises in different genres, for example analytical and argumentative texts. It also includes oral parts in which the students develop their abilities to account for facts and arguments from various written and spoken sources. The students also study complex texts on Swedish society, in order to have the opportunity to extend their vocabulary and develop their abilities to express themselves in speech and writing.

Participation in oral and written examinations is compulsory.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is delivered in the form of lectures and exercises, individually and in groups.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

In order to receive the grade of pass, the student must achieve the course objectives.

The grade of A is the highest grade and the grade of E is the lowest grade for passing the course. The grade of F means that the student has failed the course. The grading

criteria are available in a document communicated to the students when the course starts.

The course is examined through written examinations, oral presentations and continuous oral and written examinations.

For students who do not pass the first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with local regulations at the university.

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are communicated to the students who have taken the course and the students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time. The evaluation is anonymous. The course evaluation is filed according to departmental regulations.
