Objectives

On completion of the course, students should be able to:

- describe a caring encounter from a perspective of caring science
- problematize the meanings of a caring encounter
- reflect on content and process in encounters with a caring approach
- reflect on ethical issues in encounters with a caring approach
- reflect on and plan their own development of skills related to managing caring encounters

- Self-awareness

The course includes clinical training covering one week (1.5 credits).

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The course is examined with individual written examination based on encounters with caring approach during workplace education as well as in a seminar. In order to receive the grade of Pass (G), all expected learning outcomes must be achieved. In order to receive the grade of Pass with Distinction (VG) on the course requires Pass with Distinction (VG) on written examination.

A resit examination is offered according to local rules for examinations on first-level and advanced level at Linnaeus University , the latest valid version. Students at Linnaeus University can, at request, receive their grades in ECTS credits, according to the ECTS-scale. This re-quest should be made at the introduction of the course.

Course Evaluation

A written evaluation is carried out and compiled in a report, which is archived at the institution. The results, along with possible measures taken, are reported to the students the next time the course is given.
