Prerequisites

Objectives

Module 1. Linguistics theme course I, 7.5 credits

Module 2. Linguistics theme course II, 7.5 credits

After completing the module, the student should be able to:

- account for knowledge about and discuss one or several specific thematic areas within linguistics;
- use language that is appropriate for the given context.

Content

All sessions marked as seminars in the schedule are compulsory.

Module 1 Linguistics theme course I 7.5 credits

This module includes study and discussion of the literature and a selection of articles covering one or several specific thematic areas of linguistics. The texts are related to relevant linguistic issues and methods.

Module 2 Linguistics theme course II 7.5 credits

This module includes study and discussion of the literature and a selection of articles covering one or several specific thematic areas of linguistics. The texts are related to relevant linguistic issues and methods.

Type of Instruction

Teaching is delivered in the form of obligatory seminars, where the students are expected to contribute in a constructive way. Some parts of the teaching may include ICT. For specific technical requirements, see the text about technical requirements on the course website on lnu.se.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

In order to receive the grade of Pass, the student must achieve the objectives. Grading criteria for the grade of Pass with Distinction (VG) will be specified in writing when the course starts.

Module 1 and 2 are examined through oral presentations and written hand-in assignments.

If the university has decided that a student has the right to special educational support due to a disability, the examiner may offer an adapted test or allow the student to conduct the test in an alternative form.

For students who do not pass their first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examinations at the first and second levels at Linnaeus University.

Course Evaluation

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are communicated to the students who have taken the course and the students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time. The evaluation is anonymous.
