### Expected learning outcomes

On successful completion of the course the student shall be able to:

- plan, carry through and report a project using suitable methods and tools
- demonstrate understanding of project management concepts and practices
- critically analyse the project organization and the different forms of management and leadership presented in the course literature
- reflect upon the social significance of project management and the different forms of project leadership and organization

### Type of Instruction

The teaching consists of a film show, literature seminars and project workshops.

Participation/attendance in seminars is compulsory. The students are required to do a large amount of work on their own, like reading the literature.

### Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The course is assessed through active participation in seminars, individual papers, a project report and an individual take home examination.

A retest will be offered a few weeks after the original test for students who have not successfully passed the original test. At least 5 tests will be offered.

The grades are Pass with Distinction (80%-100%), Pass (60%-79%) or Failure (0%-59%).

Students at Linnaeus University are entitled to have the course grade translated into the 7-step ECTS scale. A request to have the grades translated must be made to the teacher at the start of the course.

### Course Evaluation

A written course evaluation is performed and compiled into a report to be kept in the university school archives. The result and any measures taken are communicated to the course co-ordinator and presented to the students participating the next time the course is offered.
