Prerequisites

Business administration 60 credits on G1N and G1F level of which at least 15 credits
organisation or the equivalent as well as English 6, or the equivalent.

Objectives

After completing this course the student should be able to:

- describe and contrast different ways of understanding people and work in organisations

- identify contemporary challenges for people and work in organisations
- explain the relation between people, organisations, and work by means of critical use of scientific ideas
- explain and approach different issues that may arise for people and their work in organisations.

Content

The course contains:

- contemporary challenges for people and work in organisations
- management, control, and organisation of people and work
- culture and identity
- change and learning
- gender and diversity
- technological change and digitalisation
- organisational misbehaviour and ethics

Type of Instruction

The teaching consists of lectures, seminars, workshops, and group assignments. Active participation in compulsory seminars and workshops is required for passing the course. Dates for compulsory components are stated in the schedule. Written assignments may be given as replacement in the event of absence during the compulsory component.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E or F.

The course is examined through a take-home exam 4.5 credits, group assignments 2 credits and an individual assignment 1 credit.

The grade A constitutes the highest grade on the scale and the remaining grades follow in descending order where the grade E is the lowest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as fail.

Repeat examination is offered in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examination at the first and second-cycle level at Linnaeus University. An examiner can, in exceptional cases, decide that a student who is close to the level for a passing grade may carry out supplementary assignments in order to reach the passing grade.

If the university has decided that a student is entitled to special pedagogical support due to a disability, the examiner has the right to give a customised exam or to have the student conduct the exam in an alternative way.

Course Evaluation

During the implementation of the course or in close conjunction with the course, a

course evaluation is to be carried out. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are to be promptly presented as feedback to the students who have completed the course. Students who participate during the next course instance receive feedback at the start of the course. The course evaluation are in regular carried out anonymously.
