Prerequisites

Business Administration I-II, 60 credits and at least 7,5 credits Management Accounting at level G2 and 7,5 credits research method.

Objectives

On completion of the course, students should be able to:

- write and defend a scientifically structured degree project
- identify, demarcate and formulate a problem with scientific relevance
- account for and motivate their choice of method and demonstrate an understanding for its consequences
- identify and work with relevant theoretical sources, as well as utilise them for the analysis the problem
- gather empirical data that is relevant to the problem
- independently and actively carry out an opposition

Content

The course contains:

- · various perspectives on science
- · approaches to method, empiricism, theory and text production
- problem discussion and problem formulation
- · communication of the degree project and the conclusions
- opposition against another degree project

Type of Instruction

The teaching consists of seminars and tutoring of the groups.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

The degree project consists of a written report that will be defended during a seminar. Students are also required to act as opponent on another essay as part of the examination.

A degree project that is not assessed to possibly fulfill the requirements at the final tutoring is recommended not to be treated at the originally scheduled final seminar. The degree project has to be reassessed at a new final review and considered fulfilling the necessary requirements in order to be presented at a later final seminar.

Results are graded using one of the terms Passed with distinction, Pass or Fail, and A-F according to the ECTS scale. For the grade pass, the expected learning outcomes have to be reached; the grade is based upon the degree to which the learning outcomes are met. The weighing of the grades to the course grade is following the principles in the document "Principer för betygsrapportering dnr 2011/160".

Course Evaluation

A written course evaluation is carried out and compiled in a report, which is archived at the faculty. The results and possible measures taken are communicated by the course coordinator and presented to the students the next time the course is given, or in another way deemed suitable by the course coordinator. Other types of course evaluations, for example regular evaluations throughout the course or discussions with students, will be included and encouraged with the aim of ensuring continuous quality development.
