### **Prerequisites**

75 credits business administration including research metod 7.5 credits. At least 15 credits shall be at the G2F level.

## Objectives

After completing the course the student is expected to be able to:

- independently identify and formulate limited theoretical and empirical research problems
- plan and conduct a degree project on limited time, by selecting adequate methods and by handling scientific, societal and ethical aspects
- apply scientific research methods
- demonstrate knowledge within specific parts of the theory area
- critically discuss research reports
- independently write and present a degree project in dialogue with teachers, students and case company

## Content

The course implies that the student independently, in conjunction with examiner and supervisor, formulates and executes a research project that is reported in a degree project. The degree project is written within the theory area management control and accounting.

## Type of Instruction

Teaching is carried out as distance learning with help from a learning platform and

consists of tuition and seminars. The course requires access to a computer and the internet. No mandatory meetings on campus are included.

The student is only entitled to tutoring during the course period.

### **Examination**

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

The degree project consists of a written report that will be defended during a seminar. Students are also required to act as opponent on another degree project as part of the examination.

The grade A constitutes the highest grade on the scale and the remaining grades follow in descending order where the grade E is the lowest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as fail.

Grading criteria for the A–F scale are communicated in writing to the student by the start of the course/module at the latest, as well as how grades on separate elements of examination are weighed to a final course grade.

A degree project that is not assessed to possibly fulfill the requirements at the final tutoring is recommended not to be treated at the originally scheduled final seminar.

### **Course Evaluation**

During the implementation of the course or in close connection to the course a course evaluation is to be carried out. Result and analysis of the course evaluation is to be presented as feedback both to the students who have completed the course and to the students who are to participate on the course the next time it is offered. The course evaluation is to be carried out anonymously.

### **Credit Overlap**

This course cannot be part of a degree in combination with another course in which the content fully or partly correspond to the content of this course: The course overlaps 2FE24E, 2FE20E and 2FE92E with 15 credits each.
