Prerequisites

Business Administration I-II, 60 credits and at least 7.5 credits organization at level G2 and 7.5 credits research methodology, or the equivalent.

Objectives

After completing this course the student should be able to:

- identify, demarcate and formulate a problem with scientific relevance
- account for and motivate their choice of method and demonstrate an understanding for its consequences
- account for, motivate and apply the chosen problem relevant socialscientific method
- identify and work with relevant theoretical frames of reference, as well as utilise it for the analysis of the problem and the compiled empiricism
- write and defend a scientifically based thesis
- independently and actively carry out a constructive opposition on another student's degree project

Content

The course contains:

- various perspectives on science
- · approaches to method, empiricism, theory and text production
- problem discussion and problem formulation
- writing a degree project and the conclusions
- opposition against another degree project

Type of Instruction

Teaching is carried out as distance learning with help from a learning platform and consists of self-studies based on instructions from the course coordinator. The teaching consists of web-based seminars and tutoring. The course requires access to a computer and the internet. No compulsory meetings on campus are included.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

The course is assessed with the grades A-F according to the Linnaeus University's grade scales, where the grade A constitutes the highest grade on the scale and the remaining grades follow in descending order where the grade E is the lowest grade on the scale that will result in a pass. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as fail.

The course objectives are examined a seminar series of oral and written presentations/defence, as well as a written master degree report (15 credits). The examination includes oral and written oppositions on degree projects, as well as a seminar series of individual mini-oppositions. Irrespective of examination method, it is the individual student's performances that are assessed and graded. Grading criteria for the A–F scale are also communicated in writing to the student by the start of the course at the latest.

For students who do not participate in regular seminars or students whose dissertation is not approved, even after completion, there is possibility of repeat examination by the next regular course date. Repeat examination is offered in accordance with Local regulations for courses and examination at the first and second-cycle level at Linnaeus University. The date of repeat examination will be announced no later than at the final seminar. If the degree project does not reach a passing grade at the end of the course, the student's right to further tutoring ceases.

If the university has decided that a student is entitled to special pedagogical support due to a disability, the examiner has the right to give a customised exam or to have the student conduct the exam in an alternative way.

Course Evaluation

During the implementation of the course or in close conjunction with the course, a course evaluation is to be carried out. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are to be promptly presented as feedback to the students who have completed the course. Students who participate during the next course instance receive feedback at the start of the course. The course evaluation is to be carried out anonymously.
