Prerequisites

In order to be eligible to take the course, at least 60 credits are required in the main subject of your studies, and successfully completed and passed the course 1IV327 Project Management in Sports or the equivalent.

Objectives

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- under supervision plan, organise and carry out an assignment relevant to the education,
- in writing, document and compile an assignment relevant to the education,
- in writing and orally, present an assignment relevant to the education,
- analyse and examine critically the completed assignment in relation to their own

Content

The students will under supervision organise, plan, carry out and evaluate a project assignment. The students shall document the various phases of the assignment from start to finish, summarise the assignment and present this orally. The students shall also draw up an action plan to prepare the recruitment process for the future labour market. The course comprises the course components organisation, planning and realisation of tasks/assignments/projects in practice. The components documentation, compilation, evaluation and presentation of the tasks/assignments/projects are also included in the course content, as well as the preparation of an action plan.

Type of Instruction

The types of instruction consist of a practical exercise in the form of carrying out an assignment together with an external client. The instruction also consists of supervision and seminars/workshops. The types of instruction take place in cooperation with external organisations, the network for the Coaching and Sport Management programme and the LNU Career Centre.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with Distinction (VG).

Examination of the course objectives takes place by means of two assignments. Both assignments are carried out individually or in groups, where one comprises 6 credits and shall describe the student's assignment from start to finish in the form of a report, logbook and a final reflection. In the event the student fails this examination, the next opportunity to retake the examination is at the next time the course is offered. The second assignment, comprising 1.5 credits, consists of giving an oral presentation of the assignment.

In order to receive a grade of Pass in the course, both examination assignments require at least the grade of Pass. For a grade of Pass with Distinction in the course, it is required that the assignment consisting of a report, logbook and final reflection (6 credits) is assessed as Pass with Distinction and the assignment consisting of the oral presentation (1.5 credits) must be assessed as Pass.

A retake of the examination is provided in accordance with the Local Regulations for First-cycle and Second-cycle Courses and Examination at Linnaeus University.

Should the university determine that a student is entitled to special educational support due to impairment, the examiner may decide on adapted or alternative examination.

Course Evaluation

A course evaluation is carried out either during or at the end of the course. Results and analysis of the evaluation are presented to the students who have completed the course as well as to new students at the following course date, together with any improvements made.
