Prerequisites

This course is open to students who have been accepted to the Cultural Leadership Programme 180 credits and concluded approximately 135 credits of the programme courses.

Expected learning outcomes

By the end of the course the student is expected to have:

- Understanding of professional and practical work with cultural issues within the private or public sector
- Developed a professional approach to work within the cultural sector
- Knowledge about how to critically assess and reflect on cultural issues and how
 to deal with these on a practical basis at a work place
- Document knowledge about a specific cultural project or errand within the cultural sector and how this issue was dealt with at the work place

Content

The course includes the following elements:

 Supervised field training at a public institution, voluntary organisation or private work organisation that deals with cultural issues

Type of Instruction

The student will have access to a supervisor at the work place. During the course, there will be work place seminars at which students present and discuss work place assignments and literature.

The language of instruction is Swedish.

Examination

The course is assessed with the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G).

In order to pass the course the student needs to meet the expected learning outcomes.

During the work place training, the student's knowledge and skills are continuously assessed by the supervisor. The course is assessed through a practice report as well as verbal presentations at practice seminars, and after discussions with the supervisor. Regardless of the form of examination, the individual achievements of each student are always graded and assessed.

Course Evaluation

When the course has finished, an evaluation is compiled. The results are reported to the students and then archived according to the rules of the school.

Other

Additional expenses in connection to study assignments etc are paid for by the individual student

Required Reading and Additional Study Material

The student, examiner and supervisor at the work place choose literature and academic articles based on the general orientation of the work place and the specific work tasks included in the practice.
